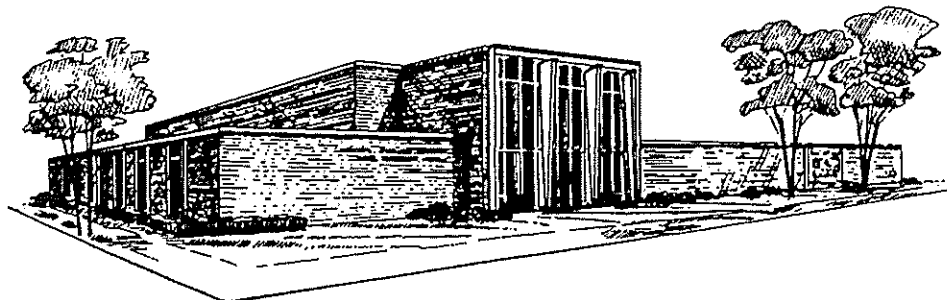

CENTENNIAL MOMENTS

Building a Legacy

June 15, 1911, Henry L. Palmer Lodge No. 301 was granted its Charter. By the end of that year, membership in the new lodge climbed to 72 Master Masons. Thirty more members (26 raised) were added during 1912, and another 53 Masons were raised the following year.

The new Lodge was very industrious, and they enjoyed a burgeoning membership. As a result of their rapid growth, they felt a need for larger and better quarters. A land parcel on First Street, between Clark and Center Streets, was purchased as a site for a permanent temple. Shortly thereafter, abundant committees were formed to attend to every detail for planning, constructing, appointing and adorning their future meeting place.

On September 1, 1913, a marching band led a spectacular parade from Guenther's Hall to the site of the new neighborhood temple. Hundreds of Masons representing local and distant lodges, plus Knights Templar in full regalia, and supplemented by a full compliment of Grand Lodge officers, all wended their way to the cornerstone laying ceremony. Speeches and song filled the air as Masons commemorated this historic day.

The two story temple was swiftly cast and framed. Soon a new structure complimenting the Egyptian style of architecture enhanced the countryside. A great reception on February 18, 1914, was held to celebrate the completion of Milwaukee's newest Masonic temple. Henry L. Palmer Lodge rocketed into an upwardly spiralling period of growth. In six short years, the lodge enjoyed a nearly ten fold increase to a total of 444 members.

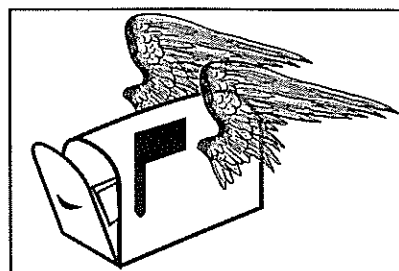
ROYAL ARCH MASONS

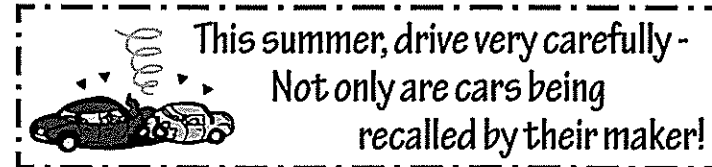
