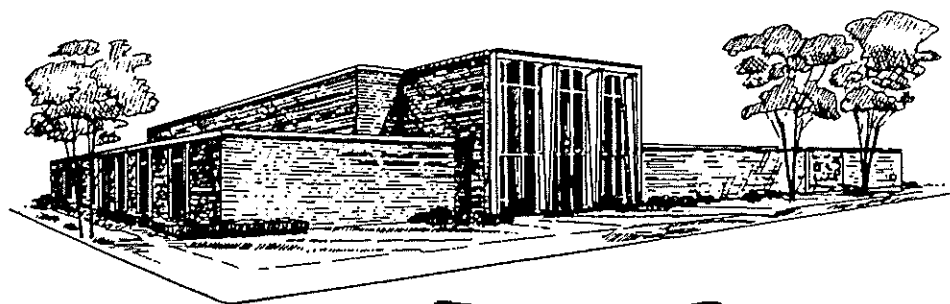

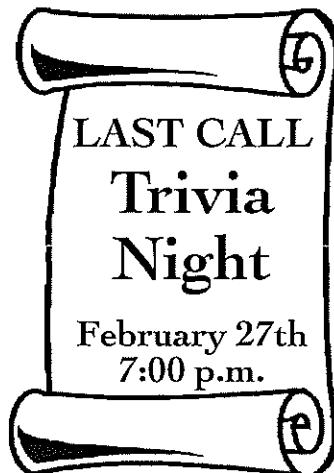

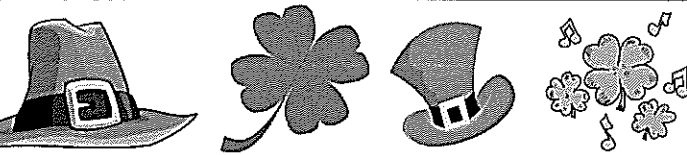

Overnight fires had totally destroyed all the contents of two school children's homes. They escaped the fires with only the clothes on their backs. Following up on the Principal's lead, the Fund provided essential clothing for these kids in less than 8 hours. While others were still making decisions, our fund reacted, and the kids were back in school the next day.

Bro. Wackman emphasized that the recipients of Fund assistance are only aware that their help is provided by Masonic Angels; no individuals are ever identified. But the fund knows who its angels are.
